



Final Project: What Does “Home” Mean to Me?



Your Task

Create a short **video or audio project** to share your personal idea of “**home**”, and **include the English verse** you wrote earlier.

Your project will use the **French song** (the one studied in class) as background music 🎵.

You can:

- Speak **alone, with a partner, or in a small group (3–4 students)**
- Use **images, subtitles, or drawings** to make your video more expressive



What to Include in Your Project

1. 💬 Your personal vision of “home”

- Is it a place? A feeling? A memory? A person?
- What emotions do you associate with it?
- Is “home” the same as “house”? Why / Why not?

2. 🎵 The English verse you wrote

- Perform it (spoken or sung)
- Make sure it follows the rhythm and rhyme structure studied
- It must relate to your own story or feelings

3. 🔗 A connection

- Refer to one of the **songs** studied (Castle on the Hill / Take Me Home, Country Roads / the French song)
- OR one of the **testimonies** (videos or texts)
- OR your own cultural/family experience



Creative Tips

- Use the **French song’s instrumental or melody** as the background 🎵
- Add:

- Photos / drawings
- Artistic effects (filters, text, animation...)
- Images from your real life that illustrate your presentation

Length

- Speaking time: **1–2 minutes per person**
- Group video: **max 5 minutes**
- Your **English verse**: around **4 lines**
